You have the right to access services you need with reasonable accommodations. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the Unruh Civil Rights Act and the Disabled Persons Act prohibit disability discrimination by California businesses and government agencies. Present this wallet card to help you explain your rights and request the accommodations you need in places like the grocery store, agency offices and other businesses.

Know Your Rights in California: Places of Public Accommodation and Government Agencies

- The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the Unruh Civil Rights Act and the Disabled Persons Act prevent disability discrimination by California businesses and government agencies.
- This means that, as a person with a disability, I am entitled to reasonable accommodations that allow me to access the services I need in a safe and effective manner.
- A reasonable accommodation is a modification in policy or practice that allows me to access services I need.
- I am presenting this card so we can discuss the accommodations I need to meaningfully access the services you provide.
